On April 2 - 4, 2017, the very first meeting of the new Dicastery for the Promotion of Integral Human Development was held at the New Synod Hall in Vatican City. Among the 250 people

invited to the meeting was Fr. Michael G. Zaniolo, STL, CAC, President of the National Conference of Catholic Airport Chaplains in the USA and Administrator/Catholic Chaplain of O'Hare and Midway International Airports in Chicago.

Last August, the Holy Father announced that he was combining four Pontifical Councils into one new Dicastery. The Dicastery will promote the social teaching of the Church in order to imbue social, economic, and political relations with the spirit of the Gospel.

The former Pontifical Council for the Pastoral Care of Migrants and Itinerant Peoples had airport chaplaincy as one of its sectors of responsibility. It is now a sector of the Dicastery for the Promotion of Integral Human Development.

This first meeting was an opportunity for all the members of the former Pontifical Councils to get to know each other as members of a new, larger organization. "I was happy to see a few familiar faces there, especially my European colleague, Fr. Michel Gaillard," Fr. Zaniolo said. Fr. Michel is the Secretary General of the Vatican's European Civil Aviation Secretariat.

The various presentations at the meeting reflected upon the encyclical *Populorum Progressio* of Pope Paul VI, promulgated on March 26, 1967. "It is amazing," said Fr. Zaniolo, "that the challenges in society that Pope Paul wrote about in his encyclical are still very much the challenges we face 50 years later!"
